The Vice Chancellor informed the Board that KIIT has recently invested Rupees 500 crore to build up a very good Central Research Facility Now-a-days many industrial and other organizations are requesting the University to use the Central Research Facility. She stated in previous year faculty members are filing more than 200 patents and KIIT is expecting more and more patents to be filed in near future. Whatever the Revenue generated, major share of the contribution will be given to the Researcher and the revenue coming to KIIT will be utilized for the development of Central Research Facilities and for the benefit of the faculty members and researchers.

Vice Chancellor informed the Board that KIIT is establishing a Technology Enabling Centre (TEC) after getting approval of Department of Science and Technology, where two full time consultant is appointed to guide the faculty and researcher.

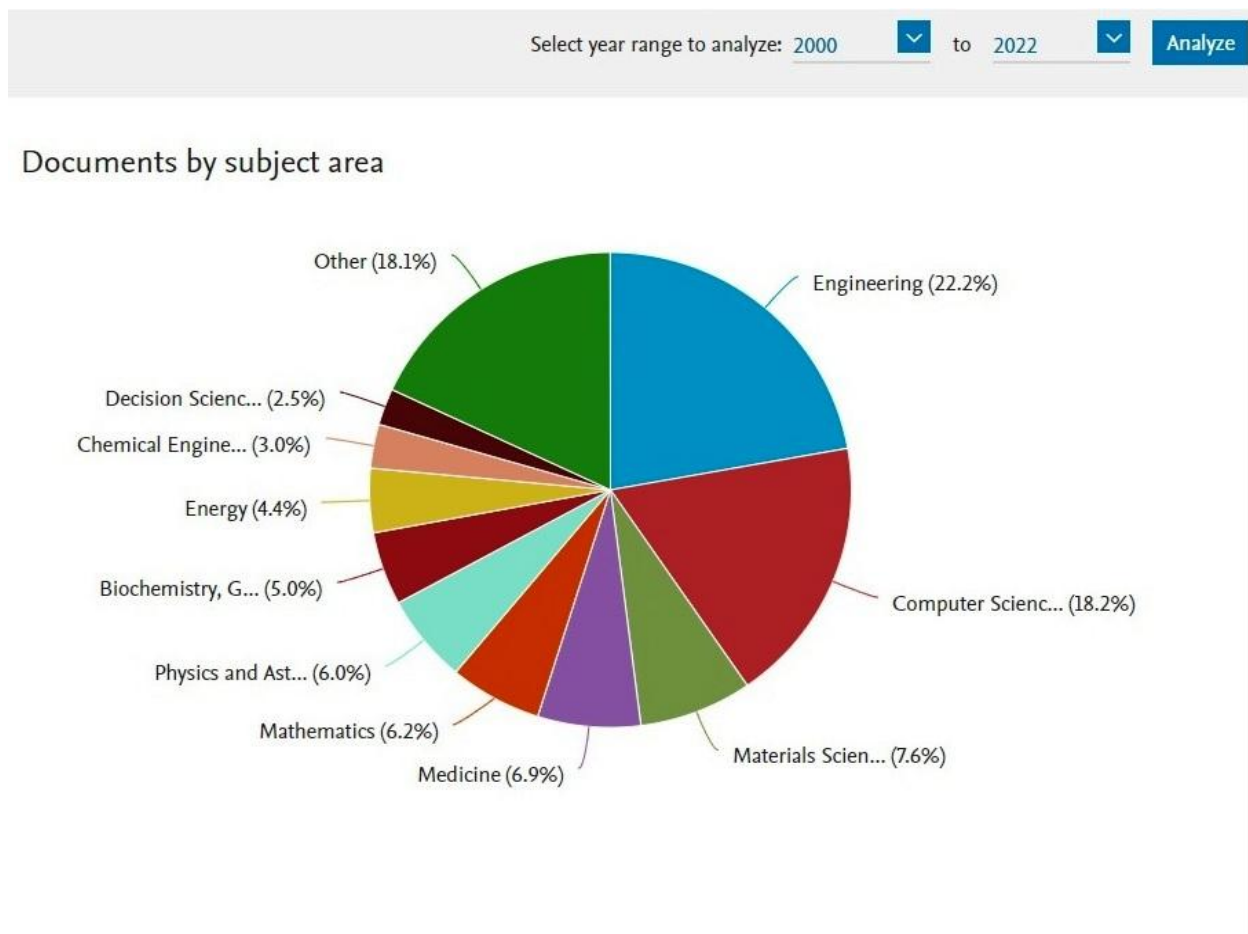

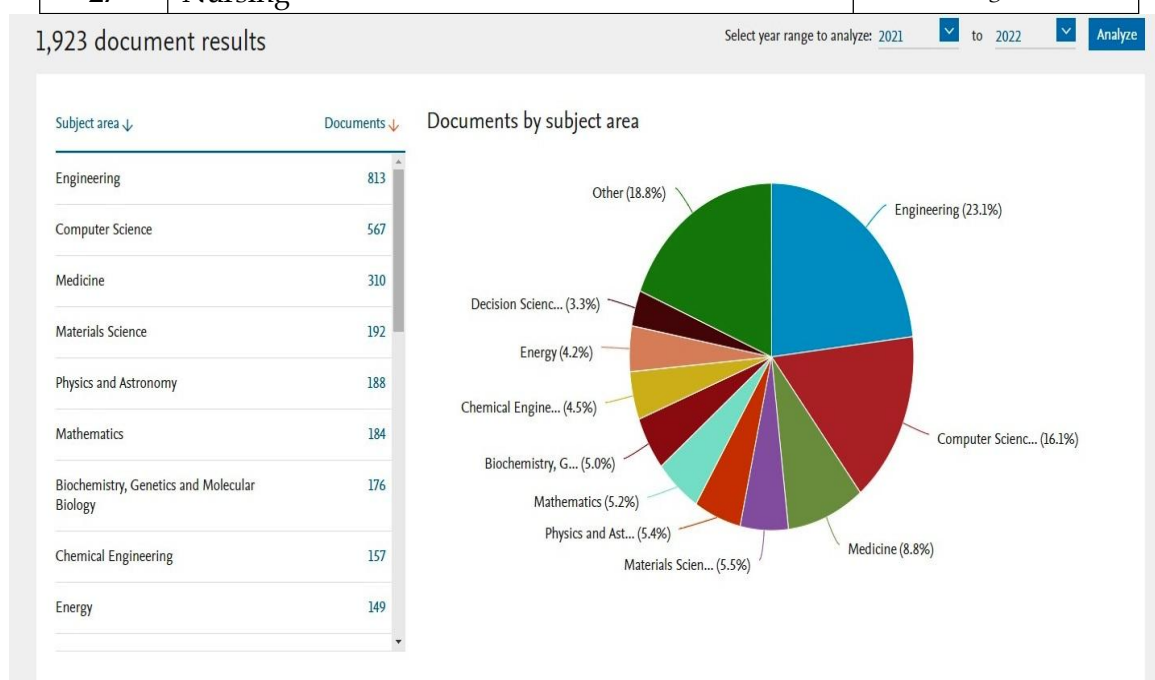

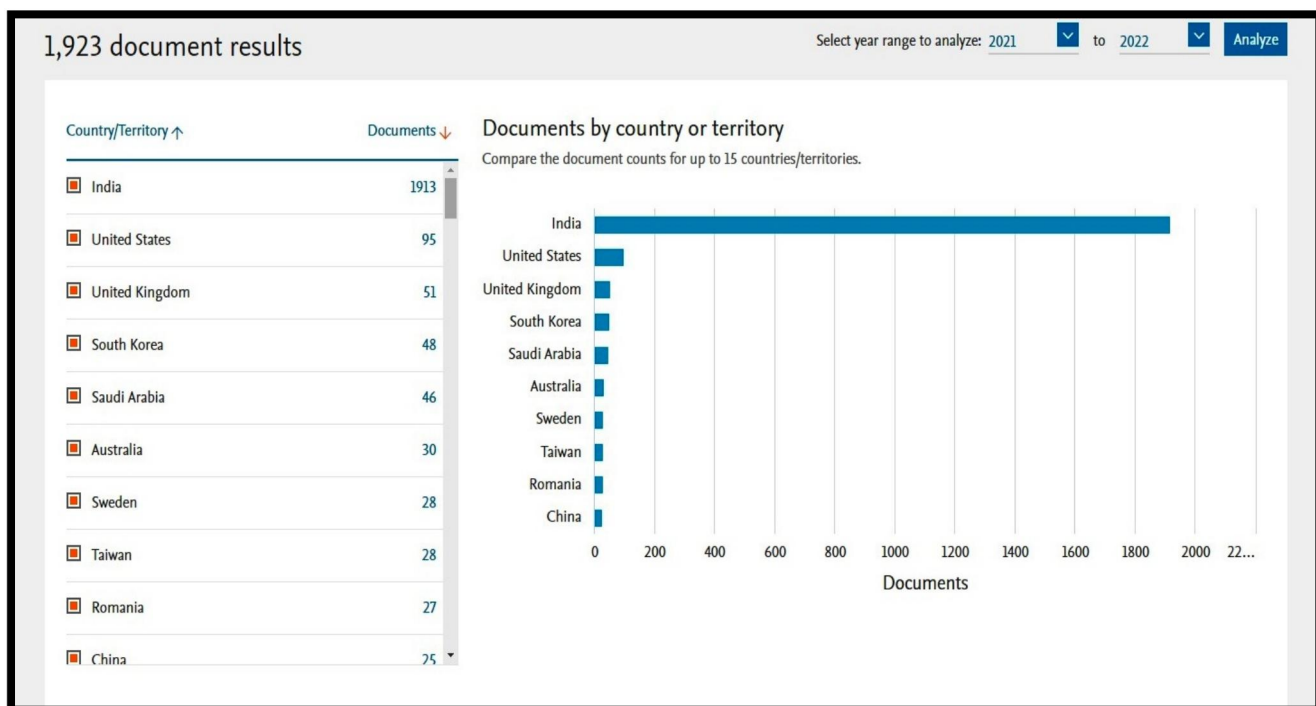

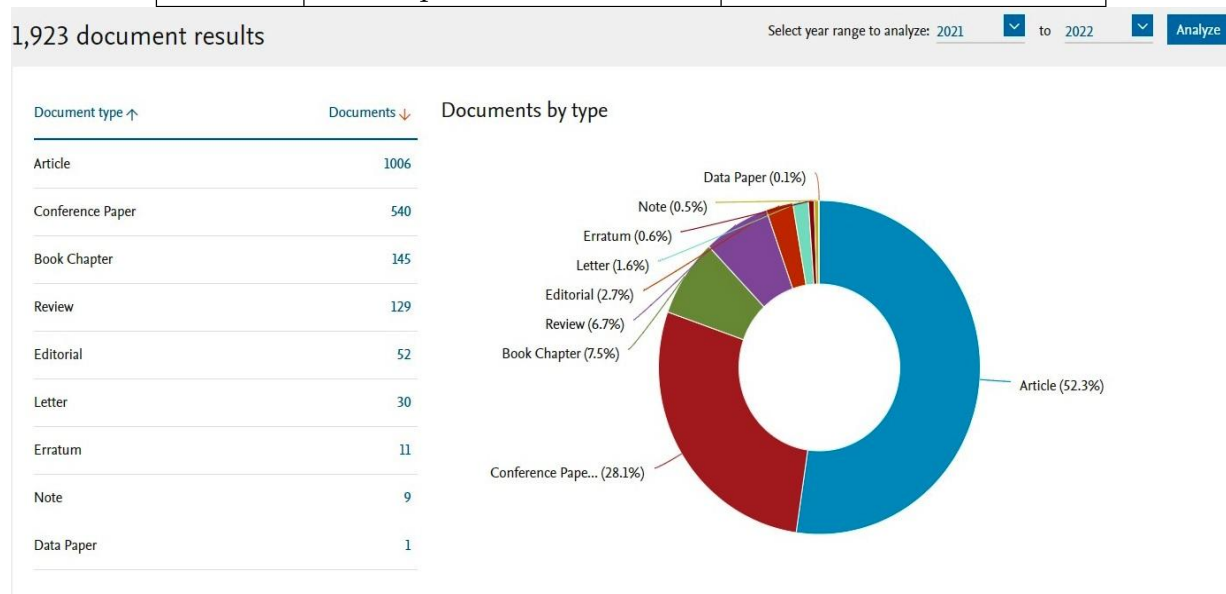
